:: Beaches

The beaches in Denia are separated by the harbour. North of it you find the Malvarossa and the Cabana arena, the more livelier and youthful public beaches. South of the harbour are the quieter beaches. Denia must be recommend to any traveller interested in its gastronomy the typical "Paella".

Denia Beaches - Les Marines Beach (see photo)

Les Marines presents the beaches characteristic from the north zone of Denia, very extensive beaches with fine sand. Les Marines Beach is an open beach and has the Blue Flag.

Denia Beaches - Les Rotes Beach

Les Rotes Beach is located to the south of Denia, it constitutes a few small coves with places of incredible beauty. It is the area known as Les Rotes, where creeks with turquoise waters follow one another.

Denia Beaches - Les Deveses Beach

Les Deveses Beach is the beach with the major extension in the term of Denia, which is characterised for being submitted to considerable winds, which make it possible to practise sailing.

:: Denia - background

Denia has almost twenty kilometers of coastline. To the north of the town, there are beaches of fine sand and shallow waters such as Les Marines, L'Almadrava, Les Deveses, Les Bovetes and els Palmars. To the south lie a series of small coves along the rocky coast, known as Les Rotes, which is a paradise for fishermen and divers. The Montgo Mountain, shared by Denia and Javea, is the major landmark of the area.

The town sits at the foot of a hill crowned by a castle, a fortress containing the remains of all the people that once paused here on their way through history. The castle is the residence of the erstwhile Marquis of Denia, and of note are the Mig, Galliner and Carsell towers, and the so-called Palace of the Governor, as well as its walls and bastions. From the hilltop esplanade you'll have an excellent view of Denia and its environs.

Depart Alicante Airport follow signs for VALENCIA,
Join A-7 (E15) follow signs for VALENCIA,
Stay on A-7 (E15) until you reach exit 62 towards Ondara/Denia/Javea,

On exiting the toll both keep right, joining the N-332 towards ONDARA, stay on this road and you go through Ondara and then when you pass through El Vergel, the road swings to the left, on your right you pass a garage and then a police station, when you reach and enter the roundabout keep right and follow the sign to Els Poblets almost turning back on yourself (if you miss the turning just go around the roundabout), look for blue and cream houses on your left, turn left then right, No 2 is on the right.

:: Places to go & things to do

There are many places to go & things to do in Denia!

Among the monuments in the town, we would recommend a visit to the 18th - century church of the Asuncion; the 17th - century Atarazanas (dockyards); the cloister and church of San Antonio and the 18th - century, neoclassical town hall building. Outside the town we can suggest the so-called hermitages of the conquest - Santa Joan (gothic), Santa Paula and Santa Lucia (gothic), constructed in the 14th and 15th centuries, and also the Torre del Gerro (17th C.) located on the cliff next to the cape of San Antonio.

Make your way up to the castle and visit the Archaeological Museum. The exhibits will take you on a journey through the past, from the 2nd century B.C. to the 18th century of our era. The Ethnological Museum in town provides an interesting showcase highlighting Denia's traditional crops, particularly the production of raisins. If you feel strong enough, conquer the peak of Montgo (about 5 hours in all), You'll find it hard to forget the panoramic view from the top. On a clear day you can see the island of Ibiza. Windsurfers should head straight for the end of Las Marinas, an area held in high esteem by their kin. If it's nightlife you want, there's an incredible array of cafes, pubs, discos and nightspots in the Las Marinas district.
